Web 2.0 productivity tools for online collaboration and production enable instructors to give interactive group projects, monitor/communicate with students and collaborate with colleagues online for different projects. Also, group members will be able to interact with each other, the content and the instructor, and finally the whole class will work in an interactive and collaborative environment. Online collaboration tools will provide communication, social relationships and a sense of community for online courses that is usually present in traditional classrooms.

In order for faculty to be able to take advantage of online collaboration tools, CTI provides training on different Web 2.0 applications such as the Google productivity tools, (Google Drive) Audacity and other used for online collaboration, production and social networking. As the result of the training, faculty members can use these free Web 2.0 collaboration software to create and share documents and presentations, collect data, socialize online and build the interactivity between students, students and content and online student collaboration projects.



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Attendance in D2L

In between the 2013 summer and fall semesters attendance will be integrated/added as a D2L component to every Langston course. This means each instructor can take attendance directly in the course during the class period. Instructors will have a choice of assigning a letter of “P” for present, “A” for absent, “T” for tardy and “E” for excused to each student during the class period. This option will provide up to date information for faculty and students at anytime. Also, students will be able to see their attendance status in the class at anytime if they go to the attendance section of their course in D2L and click on their name.
